Will Vee be able to keep her secret safe, and find some peace with Sam and her friends even in the midst of war?



Larchfield is about the ability of the human imagination to transcend terrible circumstances. Atmospheric as a modern-day Rebecca, this page turning novel combines the real and the fictional to show how little the distinction really matters.





She's not sure who they are from; she knows simply that Francesco is hiding something.

As Elena discovers the truth about the group of prisoners, she is horrified and the fine line between love and hate pulls her towards an act that can only have terrible consequences for all.

Seductive, moving and full of insight into the desperate acts committed by individuals when fighting for their lives and their rights, *Mussolini's Island* is a powerful exploration of sexuality and desire, of hidden passions and the secrets we keep locked within us.
