





































Wolfgang Hohlbein: THE MURDER HOTEL Thriller 847 pages

A dark thriller about one of the most vicious serial killers in American history

Based on the incredible but true story of America's first serial killer, who used a three-story hotel to commit the most hideous crimes of all times, Wolfgang Hohlbein has written THE MURDER HOTEL, a thriller that allows the reader to look into the mind of the serial killer.

Chicago, at the end of the 19th century: He killed more than 230 people – Herman Webster Mudgett is one of the most remarkable murderers in history. Not only has Mudgett a special talent for homicide but he is also extremely business savvy. He cons his victims out of their money and sells their skeletons and organs to medical schools. Under the alias of Henry Howard Holmes, he has his own hotel built in Chicago, which is specifically designed to help him perfect his murder skills: a horror castle with secret doors, hidden passages, a torture table, an acid pit, and a gas chamber. Nobody knows about the evil behind these walls – but then, in 1893, the nineteenth World's Fair opens its gates. Among the millions of visitors pouring into the city are Arlis Christen and Frank Geier, a private investigator. They are searching for Arlis's sister. Before she went missing, she stayed at Holmes's Hotel and was in a relationship with a certain Mr. Mudgett. Arlis and Geier move into the murder hotel and start asking uncomfortable questions. Soon they begin to realize who Henry Howard Holmes really is and this puts them in mortal danger.

Wolfgang Hohlbein, born in Weimar 1953, lives with his wife and his family in the vicinity of Düsseldorf. Wolfgang Hohlbein is a storyteller, who is not only driven by the joy of fabulating but also inspired by the free play with unusual ideas and fantastic concepts. Wolfgang Hohlbein has received numerous prices and awards like, for instance, the "German Fantasy Award" in 2004 and the "Sondermann Award" in 2005.

An international high-finance thriller about a Swiss family bank



The mysterious Viktor Maly has been held in the lockdown ward of the Linz Psychiatric Clinic for one year. He suffers from partial memory loss; even his right name remains unknown. Only two things seem clear. Before he was admitted to the hospital, Viktor Maly's life was defined by violence, and he has a very special relationship with Tony Braun, chief investigator and head of the Linz homicide division.

In any event, Tony Braun has no idea what to make of this strange patient, particularly when Viktor provides the first clues to a series of brutal murders. Two young mothers, Amelie Frey and Laura Neumann, were ferociously murdered. The husbands of the two rich heiresses are acting very suspicious, but Braun has difficulty believing that private motives were responsible for the crimes. How would that explain the involvement of Maly, who in both cases led him directly to the places where the bodies were found - even though Maly was securely locked in the psychiatric unit and could not have murdered the women under any circumstances?


As Braun continues his investigation, he uncovers a vicious ring of child traffickers. The babies that were alleged to belong to Frey und Neumann were actually kidnapped from Sputnix III, a notorious slum in the Czech Republic. Their true parents are Roma who are discriminated against and receive no support whatsoever from the authorities.

With the help of his young colleague, Franka Morgen, once a denizen of Sputnix III herself, Braun gains access to the secretive community of the Roma and learns that trafficking in babies has been going on for several years. Shocked by the conditions in Sputnix III, Braun vows he will not only solve the murders but also apprehend the masterminds behind the child trafficking.

And then another detail comes to light that leads to the heart of the gruesome murders and points unmistakably to Linz: the name of the first child trafficker, who has supposedly been dead since the 1990s, is Viktor Maly.

B.C. Schiller stands for the author duo of Barbara and Christian Schiller. They live on Mallorca and in Vienna with their Rhodesian Ridgeback dog, Kajumba Jabali.






Alina Falkner: DANGEROUS WHISPERS

Alina Falkner's crime novels follow the concept of U.S. television crime dramas: a team of investigators consisting of detectives, profilers, and ballistics experts form a special unit dedicated to hunting down serial killers.

In their second case, the team of special unit KKF 2 investigates the murders of a serial killer with a tendency for ritualized killings.

A theater in Berlin has to deal with three homicides: The director's trainee is drowned in a fountain, an actor is crushed to death by a spotlight falling from the ceiling onto the main stage, and another actor dies during the memorial service for the first two victims. Rita Seidel and Theresia Pfeffer from the KKF 2 are called in, as their special unit is dedicated to hunting down serial killers. And so they start their investigations in the beautiful, yet scheming world of the theater.

Theresia Pfeffer (22), a young and ambitious patrol officer with the Essen police department, can hardly believe her luck: She was the first at the crime scene – a genuine murder case! With a combination of audacity and ingenuity, she continues to get access to information and inject herself into the investigation. Due to her brilliance and wit, she is able to make vital contributions to the investigation and

soon she is invited to work on the case. Meanwhile, the BKA send their best operative to all three cities: case analyst Dr. Rita Seidel (39). Her job is just to analyze but she gets tangled up in the investigation. In the further course of the story, her life will be in danger because it seems that she is the main target of the killer! In the end, she will manage to find the perpetrator but she will not escape unharmed.

Franz Hafermeyer: THE DEAD DON'T SMILE

THE DEAD DON'T SMILE is Franz Hafermeyer's debut novel and features the first case for the investigator duo of Elsa Dorn and Sven Schäfer. The author is a detective himself, which makes his stories particularly authentic and believable. Exciting, funny, and full of surprising turns and quirky yet convincing characters.

Augsburg is being jolted by bloody murders. The king of the local pimps and a respected city councilman have been viciously slaughtered. A picture of Archangel Gabriel is found near both bodies. Apparently it was the work of a fanatical maniac, or so the official version runs. But Elsa Dom, an ambitious detective who is new in the precinct, has a theory of her own. She finds a helper in Sven Schäfer, a fired policeman, of all people. Soon her suspicions harden. A professional killer is on the loose in Swabia, and he's far from fulfilling all of his contracts.

Franz Hafermeyer isn't named Franz Hafermeyer in real life. The author himself holds a full-time job hunting down the bad boys, and they are not supposed to know the profoundly dark side of the friendly detective sitting across from them. What is absolutely true, however, is that he and his family live in the Bavarian part of Swabia very close to Augsburg.





Erwin Kohl: DEAD FOR A DAMN LONG TIME

DEAD FOR A DAMN LONG TIME is the prelude to a new detective series.

Chief investigator Lukas Born has been suspended but is investigating a death on his own initiative. The deceased is an acquaintance of his, a certain Wolfgang Lodzinski, who supposedly committed suicide in a flooded gravel pit. Born doesn't believe it was a suicide, obtains the address of the victim from a former colleague, and finds evidence in Lodzinski's apartment that he was a top athlete in the former GDR. In a closet, Born finds not only newspaper clippings and numerous awards but also an Olympic bronze medal that Wolfgang won in swimming at the 1988 games in Seoul. Born is suspicious.

Further investigation leads him to a social worker who was apparently in touch with Lodzinski on a regular basis. He learns that constantly taking excessive doses of doping drugs had severely damaged Lodzinski's health. He had been denied compensation based on a lack of evidence, and the former top athlete was dependent on welfare. Apparently, Lodzinski had only one purpose left in life: bringing those who were culpable to justice.

Erwin Kohl was born in Alpen, on the Lower Rhine, in 1961. Before he began writing in 2001, he worked in many different fields: as a taxi driver, an innkeeper, an ice cream vendor, a cinema operator, matchmaker, insurance agent, disc jockey, and cemetery gardener. In his mysteries, he particularly enjoys outlining the diverse characters he came to know during his occupational career. He lives in Wesel, on the Lower Rhine.

ALL THE THINGS WE NEVER SAID is an emotional novel about a woman in her late thirties who is forced to confront the traumatic experiences of her past and sort out her life. A novel that will stay with the reader long after reading the book – emotional, complex, and touching.

Everything seems to be under control in Katja's life. For almost twenty years, she has been married to Oliver, a handsome dermatologist, their daughter, Emma, turned out to be a great kid, and Oliver's income as a physician provides them with a comfortable lifestyle. Katja works part time in Oliver's practice and devotes the rest of her time to her duties as a housewife and mother residing in the posh suburbs.

But Katja's perfect little world is built on sand, as she has never been able to get over the stillbirth of her second child. These memories come back with a vengeance when Emma sets out to participate in a monthslong student exchange program and Katja is forced to face up to the huge void in her life. Why did she sacrifice so many of her dreams for her role as a physician's wife? And are things just going to get worse once Emma is all grown up and on her own?

A visit from Oliver's old friend from school, Theo, who lives in the United States, unsettles Katja even more, as she feels right from the start very close to this man who is pretty much a stranger. While she is still trying to ignore these feelings, Oliver drops a bombshell: He has fallen in love with another woman and wants a trial separation.

Katja is at a complete loss and wonders what she should do. Quickly, she decides to travel to Montana, to Theo. And lo and behold: Amidst the wild landscapes of Montana and by Theo's side, she finds the strength to confront the demons of her past and, finally, a new courage to face life. The temptation to simply stay with him in the American Northwest and leave Germany behind is tremendous. But Katja has learned during the past few weeks and months that the easy way isn't always the best. So she returns to Kiel to sort out the life she has there. When Oliver announces to her that he wants to make their separation official, her first reaction is complete shock but then she realizes that she still has a lot of respect for her husband but that she stopped loving him a long time ago. A wonderful book for gardening enthusiasts who would like to know things a little more precisely

Gardening, they say, is the only passion that increases as you grow older. Jörg Albrecht can confirm that, at least in part. As a child, he hated having to mow the lawn. In the meantime, he loves the smell of freshly cut grass, and almost everything that has to do with gardening. For him, life without a garden would be possible but meaningless.

EVERYTHING ABOUT THE GREEN SPACE provides popular background knowledge on more than 150 topics and keywords pertaining to nature, plants, and gardening. And Jörg Albrecht's topics are as diverse and practical for daily life as nature and plants themselves. The author writes about thyme, dry stone masonry, walnut trees, and hedge trimming but also about sheep, sheep dogs, and the last shepherd in the village - about life in the loam and the cold-hardiness of plants when the dark season approaches.

And in addition to all the useful information Albrecht provides, the texts are simply great fun to read. An absolute pleasure in the best sense of the word, this is a book only a polymath and esthete could write.

In 2010, Stefan Bauer discovered a job announcement for paramedic positions in Saudi Arabia. Out of a love of adventure he applied. A few short weeks later, the paramedic landed in the heat of Riyadh. Even during his first days, he noticed that the Arabian country was different than he had expected. Chaotic airports, throngs of pilgrims, an inconceivably complicated bureaucracy, and days of power blackouts in his lodgings were only the beginning.

On his emergency calls, Stefan Bauer fights for the rich and the poor, he sees horrible prisons and huge ghettos, treats neglected guest workers and abandoned babies. Yet at the same time he encounters the immense hospitality of the natives. Curious young Saudis debate candidly with the German about politics and religion. And he additionally develops heartfelt ties of friendship with his Saudi and international colleagues who share the compound where he lives.

These sometimes incredible stories are narrated in an entertaining, fast-paced, and riveting style. They illustrate the fascinating discrepancy between the alarming brutality of daily life on the one hand, and the hospitable, cordial, and inquisitive ways of the Saudis on the other. And they provide a unique, unfiltered look at an Islamic society that is completely alien to us and yet has more to do with us than many people believe.

Stefan Bauer is a pseudonym the author has chosen out of consideration for his current employer. He is a trained paramedic, and from 1999 to 2012 held volunteer and paid positions in disaster management and emergency medical services in Germany, Switzerland, and Saudi Arabia. From June 2011 to June 2012 he served as a paramedic for the Saudi Red Crescent Authority in Riyadh. He is the father of a six-year-old daughter.

In her book, Sigi Kube has collected the most outlandish and surprising ways that intellectual giants and historical personalities have died. It is astonishing that many of these stars and starlets which shone so brightly died out in such peculiar ways. It may often be tragic, yet it is not at all unusual for the course of many an exciting life to be dramatized by a spectacular ending. Such deaths often seem fateful but are by no means a rarity throughout history.

To illustrate, Jordanian actor Mahmud al-Sawalka died during the filming of a death scene he was playing. And Oliver Cromwell, who ruled over England in the 16th century, was found guilty of regicide on his predecessor three months after he himself had died of malaria. To make absolutely certain there was no mistake, his body was unceremoniously dug up, and he was executed posthumously.

The death of Isadora Duncan has gone down in medical literature as "accidental strangulation by a vehicle." As she drove off, her overly long, billowing silk scarf became entangled in the spokes of her sports car and choked her to death. It is primarily the result of the dancer's sensational demise that her name remains known to this day.

Lydia Möcklinghoff is a zoologist. Since 2009 she has been researching the behavior and ecology of the Great Anteater in the Pantanal, an enormous wetland area and nature sanctuary in Brazil and one of the most species-rich animal havens in the world. For the last nine years, she has been spending half of her time on a cattle ranch there, four hours from the nearest village.

Lydia's work and daily life are full of adventure. The Pantanal is home not only to peaceful and not so clever anteaters, but also jaguars, buffalo, and boar. Precarious situations with wild animals are no rarity. In front of Lydia's door, foxes fight over her shoes. A frog sings a happy song in the tank of her toilet, and when boar are once again routing through the front garden, the cowboy next door sometimes comes out of the house in his pajamas and fires his rifle into the air.

Her work as a zoologist is an important contribution to the preservation of the species living in the area. The more that is known about the role of the anteater as part of the ecosystem, the better one can protect this animal and all of the others - for in this remote region, wildlife biodiversity is threatened. And when Lydia recounts how she slashes her way through the undergrowth with a machete or winds down the evening with a Caipirinha, the heart of every city dweller beats faster.

A touching personal story and a powerful plea on behalf of voluntary death

In FAREWELL WITHOUT TEARS Anett Gräfe recounts how she accompanied her mother - bed-ridden as the result of an automobile accident - to Switzerland for an assisted suicide. The book is a touching mother-daughter story and raises the question of how to cope with the situation when close family members ask for a voluntary death.

In the summer of 2012, Anett Gräfe received a call from the autobahn police informing her that her mother, Jana, had an accident: her car had collided with another. Anett immediately drove to the hospital in Chemnitz, where she learned that her mother had suffered an irreversible spinal cord contusion and was paralyzed from the neck down. Even at this early stage, her mother was already expressing the wish that she would not have to continue living that way, but Anett tried to provide encouragement. She gathered information on treatment methods, rehabilitation measures, and nursing facilities. Yet despite all of her efforts, her mother's dire condition remained unchanged. Once she had been an enthusiastic sportswoman; she could now move only her head. Ever more often, the 63-year-old was expressing the desire to die.

After almost 2 years, Anett accepted her mother's decision. She inquired about assisted suicide in Germany, sought the support of doctors and friends, and ultimately found a hospice in Basel. On October 9, 2014, Anett and her mother traveled to Switzerland. The day before the assisted suicide the two paid one final visit to the zoo. Her mother loved animals. And then the time had come. Using her mouth, Jana opened a vial of liquid, falling asleep peacefully in her daughter's arms only seconds later.

Anett Gräfe claims that she was never as close to her mother as when she died. The author says that dying was her mother's most urgent wish. She asserts that everyone must have the option of concluding their life voluntarily, for every person has the right to a dignified end.

Anett Gräfe was born in 1981 in Zittau and grew up in Konstanz. After studying business education she worked full-time for several years as a project and event manager before starting an agency of her own called *eventrose*. She lives in Kreuzlingen, Switzerland.

It doesn't slip her mother's attention that her daughter is in love and when Alexa is away for a few days for a vacation on the Baltic Sea, the countess Ehrenberg fires Bernhard Kreuzner. The young man is shocked. He hasn't done anything wrong but they pay him his salary for the rest of the year and so he leaves without having the opportunity to say good-bye to Alexa.

Three years later – by now, Bernhard works as a teacher at a school in Allenstein – they happen to meet again and their love rekindles. Alexa is engaged to be married to a man from her social circle but when she realizes that she is pregnant, she risks the scandal and leaves her family in the dead of night. Destiny takes its course and by the time mother and daughter are reconciled on the countess's deathbed, the individual family members have gone through a lot.

So it comes to no surprise that Christos changed his opinion on dogs. Experiences like these put a person's heart in the right place.

Volker Dornemann: EVIL PENGUINS


