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
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






































































Andreas Eschbach: THE DEVIL'S GOLD

A white-knuckle thriller about the stone of the philosophers

Andreas Eschbach is a writer extraordinaire, who first achieved prominence with his thriller THE JESUS VIDEO, which was followed by a spectacular sequel, THE JESUS DEAL, in 2014. With novels like ONE BILLION DOLLARS he established himself as one of Germany's top-selling authors. Now, his latest novel will be released, a brilliant thriller with a fast-paced storyline and superbly developed characters that takes place on two time levels.

It makes its first appearance in the Middle Ages, after the end of the Crusades: The Philosopher's Stone that allows man to make gold – dangerous gold, as it is radioactive gold. The stone appears when an alchemist curses God and it leaves a trail of devastation through Europe. The knights of the Teutonic Order make it their secret task to find it and keep it safe. For all eternity.


But in our time, two brothers, who couldn't be more different, find out about the true secret of the stone: it is the key to another form of existence, to a world of perfection, an ecstasy that is beyond imagination. Or so they say. The story starts in a quite innocent manner: A young man, who works for an investment company, flees from the rain and takes shelter in an antiquarian bookshop where he finds a little book. It tells the story of an alchemist, who came to Franconia in 1295 and seemed to have been in possession of the Philosopher's Stone. However, the stone is described in a completely different manner than usually is the case. He is so intrigued by the book that he steals it – an act that has a variety of consequences to his fate.

For he continues to do research into the background of the story. There are more and more indications that the Philosopher's Stone really exists. Then he makes the acquaintance of the owner of a castle who dabbles in alchemy and becomes his mentor – though his motives are obscure and he seems to hide something. And time and again, the clues lead to the Teutonic Knights who seem to be chasing after the secret for centuries. And what is the true secret of the stone? That it is capable of turning base metals into gold? This is just a partial aspect of the myth. Is it the key to another form of existence, to a better world? Or is it a tool of the Devil and opens the Gates to Hell?

A thriller like a stab through the heart

THE STITCHER is an abysmal and slick thriller, which doesn't have to shy away from comparisons with the works of the most popular international thriller authors such as Cody McFadyen, Chris Carter and Jean-Christoph Grangé's early works, such as "Flights of the Storks" or "Blood-Red Rivers".


With ever-changing twists and turns, the author manages to keep a continuous arc of suspense. The author's strength is the extremely haunting description of the perpetrator's psyche, which leads the reader deep into the darkness of the human soul. This sets Rainer Löffler apart from other writers in this genre. Instead of focusing on explicitly violent scenes, Löffler makes the reader's blood freeze just through his portrayal of the perpetrator's mind. The point of view, from which the story is told, changes from chapter to chapter between victim, perpetrator and investigator and thereby increases the oppressive feeling in the reader to be a part of the horrid case.

In the outskirts of Cologne, two pregnant women go missing at the same time. Martin Abel, case analyst with the Stuttgart-based State Office of Criminal Investigations, LKA, is sent to the crime scene to support the local authorities. Shortly after his arrival, they discover the bodies of a woman and her child in a subterranean cavern. The woman went missing years earlier. But not only did her killer murder her, he also placed something inside her body.

Then one of the two women who recently went missing reappears, half-dead and brutally tortured. She is able to provide the investigators with first clues about the perpetrator and Martin Abel is forced to try to understand a world of destructive fantasies, in which horror has its home and the search for inner peace sows death.

Rainer Löffler, born in 1961, whose "regular job" is that of a technical salesman, lives with his wife and three children in the vicinity of Stuttgart.

In his extremely suspenseful thriller, Gerd Schilddorfer takes his readers on an action-filled chase through Europe and Africa. Exciting locations and a logical story that combines the past with the present and is filled with many twists and turns – if you like gripping adventure stories, you should not miss out on this fast-paced thriller.

In 1781, when Joseph II, Emperor of the Holy Roman Empire, travels to the Flemish Monastery of Cambron, he learns about a century-old secret: Rumor has it that after the dissolution of the Order of the Templars, the former abbot, Yves de Lessines, wrote down the "prophecies" for which the physician and astrologist Nostradamus became famous two hundred years later.


In Lugano, a Picasso painting is stolen from the penthouse of a collector and replaced with a forgery. Two years earlier, the painting had been stolen from the Museum for Modern Art in Paris. And this is where it returns now. An international art thief, a phantom by the name of "Rebus", stole the painting back at the behest of the museum.

At the same time, John Finch, a rough pilot, flies his latest purchase, an old DC 3, from an airport in the Libyan Desert towards Tunis. Also on board are two undesirable passengers: Khamis Al-Gaddafi, the son of Muammar Al-Gaddafi, and Lieutenant Umar, an executive member of the Secret Service. He carries a thick pocketbook around with a strange painting of Nicolas Poussin that keeps preying on Finch's mind.

These three initially unrelated events are the kick-start to a breath-taking chase after one of the most spectacular revelations of the last century. Ghad and Tunis, Alexandria and Cairo, Paris and Rome, and Austria and Northern Italy are the locations where the story of this suspenseful and action-filled thriller unfolds. And time seems to catch up with the team around John Finch and Major Llewellyn and Secret Service Boss Peter Compton – relentlessly and without any mercy.

It could not have happened at a worse time: Tourist season has just begun when an obscure death rattles Norderney's early summer idyll. On the beach they find the body of the owner of a long-established pharmacy. He seems to have drowned even though the pharmacist was known to be an excellent swimmer. But the autopsy results show that the man might have died a violent death. Local police are under pressure to quickly solve the case and — preferably - rule out murder. They have to make sure that tourism does not suffer because their guests are afraid of a murderer. So they turn to Rieke Bernstein for support.

When Rieke Bernstein arrives in the island, a lot of gossip and speculations are going around. One of the rumors is that, two hundred years ago, the family of the pharmacist came into the possession of a legendary fortune that secured their survival in turbulent times. With the help of a journalist, the detective uncovers clues indicating that the family of the late pharmacist and the members of a hotel dynasty are in a feud that has been going on for generations. And in almost every generation there were unexplained deaths – despite or maybe because of the fact that there were ties between the families. They dive deep into the history of the Island of Norderney. But the closer Rieke Bernstein gets to solving the case, the bigger becomes the chance of another homicide.

THE SPÄTZLE SYNDICATE is case number two for detective Elsa Dorn. Franz Hafermeyer's mysteries are for fans of humorous regional crime novels that also recount suspenseful cases.

Elsa Dorn is frustrated. She would finally like to put all of her investigative intuition to use in hunting down killers, but her archenemy, Jansenbrink, has made sure she has to continue wasting her time on vice cases. Meanwhile the yellow press in Augsburg is having a field day with her current case: One woman after the other is losing her most exquisite lingerie to a thief. And the "underwear guy," as everybody calls him, is so skillful that his activities are slowly threatening to become a political issue. The security and virtue of Augsburg's citizens are at stake here.


And then there's a murder. The city's notorious playboy, Bruno Schattenkirchner, is found dead in his apartment surrounded by a trophy collection of tasteful underwear. The murder weapon was a lace bra. Did Schattenkirchner surprise the underwear guy in his apartment? Has the latter perhaps gone from thief to killer? Much to Jansenbrink's displeasure, the investigating officers bring in Elsa as an advisor. With much enthusiasm, she throws herself into the case and decides to investigate on her own, beginning at the "Nefertiti" swinger club where Schattenkirchner was a regular. Assisting her is private investigator Sven Schäfer. First his ex-wife was burglarized, and now he's afraid that his 17-year-old daughter, Hannah, has become a target for the underwear guy. And, in fact, the swinger club does provide very clear clues about the identity of the underwear guy. Fittingly, he has just lost his life, apparently during an autoerotic experiment. Naturally, things are never as simple as they look, and before Elsa and Schäfer can apprehend the real offender they find themselves in mortal danger.

Ellen Jacobi: A SURPRISING MURDER



Suspenseful, humorous, written in an easy-going style, and chock-full of quirky characters, A SURPRISING MURDER) is the second case for Veronika Dornbusch-Bommelbeck and senior prosecutor (retired), Lothar E. Schuknecht. The author adeptly weaves misleading cues into the novel and seduces her readers into puzzling over them.

Veronika Dornbusch-Bommelbeck, adventurous owner of a small convenience store in Biblinghausen, is worried. After a brief surge of tourism following a series of murders she solved, interest in her idyllic village in Bergisches Land is gradually drying up. On top of that, Veronika has had to close her private investigation agency due to lack of business—no matter how hard she tried to find cases. But then she receives a blackmail letter that comes as a complete surprise. A short time later, she herself is suspected of murder. The victim? Her ex-husband who has been missing for years.




MURDEROUS ANNIVERSARY

The second case for private investigator Lukas Born

The mystery series begins at a campground where former detective Lukas Born lives after being suspended. Life at this petty bourgeois place, with its diverse array of characters, gives the stories a humorous touch. Lukas Born is a likable protagonist, and in spite of the suspense readers repeatedly come across scenes that make them smile.

When Lukas returns home from a walk with his dog, Manolo, he finds journalist Natascha Feldbusch waiting for him at his door. She claims she would like Born's help with an investigation. Although she doesn't want to reveal any details, a €500 cash advance persuades Lukas- who finds himself hard up once again - to agree even without them. In the middle of the night, Lukas receives a text message inviting him to a meeting. When he arrives at the agreed place shortly afterwards, he finds Natascha Feldbusch's lifeless body lying on the ground. At that moment, he is knocked unconscious. When he wakes up, he realizes he is alone. A few hours later, a motorhome on one of the RV sites goes up in flames. The owner of the vehicle? Natascha Feldbusch. Lukas receives a text from an unknown number asking him to meet the sender at the crime site. There, in the semidarkness of the old ruins, Natascha Feldbusch is suddenly standing before him. Explaining that her life is in extreme danger, she claims she was contacted by a doctor who revealed that for years he had been receiving high commissions for prescribing medications of a certain importer. Several patients had died, and he wanted to get out. The large-scale raid that follows exposes one of the largest medical scandals in postwar history; 12 employees are arrested. Lukas Born would be able to sit back and relax, if it weren't for several gnawing questions. Why was he knocked unconscious but not killed? Why was he not put under pressure and allowed instead to take his time and gather evidence? Apparently, Natascha Feldbusch is playing a double game.

Detective Bentheim's most personal case. High suspense, straight

SOUNDING THE ALARM is Nina Ohlandt's fourth mystery novel revolving around inspector John Benthien from the Flensburg criminal investigation unit. Nina Ohlandt entertains her readers with unusual murders, a large cast of suspects, and a likable investigator team. In spite of the outrageous crimes and dubious machinations, she still makes a vacation on the coast seem attractive—a wish she creates above all by repeatedly describing the countryside and its inhabitants. This gives rise to an atmosphere that is difficult for readers to resist. In addition, almost until the end it is impossible to guess who committed the crime. While constantly presenting new clues and motives that come across as likely, she keeps readers in the dark for a long time.

On the Holnis Peninsula, the body of an unknown female is found in a garden in a hollow tree trunk. John Benthien and his team begin to investigate. It will turn out to be his most personal case because, of all the stupid things, the tree with the corpse is in the garden of his (almost) ex-father-in-law, Frieder Fahrenhost. The wintry garden seems to attract calamity. Just a few days after the body is found, Karin, Benthien's ex, from whom he separated several months earlier, is beaten to death with a bottle at the same location—shortly after having a tremendous row with him. There is no doubt in his mind that the two murders are connected, but how? Are Karin's parents involved?

For police colleague Smythe-Fluege, everything points to John Benthien. His fingerprints are on the bottle, a piece of evidence is found in his house, and he is suspected of obstruction of justice in office. Benthien is suspended, and shortly afterwards Smythe-Fluege obtains a warrant for his arrest. Is this dislikeable new colleague playing a vicious game? Detective Benthien knows two things for sure: first, he is innocent, and second, he will find the real killer.

JAMIE & THE SNAKE IN PARADISE is a charming feel-good novel and perfect entertainment for female readers who love food and/or cats.

Rebekka Frey is a cookbook author and food journalist. She writes a regular column and blog posts about regional recipes for the highly successful *Countryside* magazine. She repeatedly travels for weeks to conduct research. This time her destination is the small village of Bradehusen. As soon as she arrives, Rebekka's usual investigative instincts come into play and she begins asking around among the villagers to find the most authentic recipes possible. When a cat repeatedly crosses her path, Rebekka ultimately realizes that its favorite places to prowl are where the very best food is being prepared. Not surprisingly, it soon develops a weakness for her as its Mom, a role that Rebekka is at first only very reluctant to play. During one of her visits in the village, Rebekka makes a shocking discovery. She finds the still-warm body of old Fedder Alert and believes that as she came in she also heard a door slam shut. The police initially play down the matter but when it becomes clear that Alert was poisoned during his last meal, and that it involved a typical regional specialty, Rebekka and her cookbook project wind up in the sights of the detective in charge. The next night, someone breaks into her vacation cottage.

This leaves her no choice but to begin investigating on her own - with energetic support from the cat. Yet neither the police nor Rebekka's snooping can prevent the next murder: once again, the victim is an old man. Rebekka is certain that the motive for the series of murders lies in the past. Before she can pursue her suspicion, the cat disappears without a trace. During its rescue from the hands of the killer, there is a dramatic showdown which both she and the cat barely survive.

At any rate, after all that the fronts are clear: Rebekka has a new housemate who immediately responds to the name of "Jamie," for Jamie Oliver, and naturally also becomes her traveling companion.


MURDER IN LÜNSCHE is the kickoff to a new series of humorous crime novels featuring a quirky retired couple as investigators.

"Lünsche", as the city of Lüdenscheid in the Sauerland region is affectionately called by its sons, in the year 1972: In an old apartment building not far from downtown, Ernst Rott, a retiree, is found dead in his flat. Just another old person who had no one in his life to take care of him and died lonely... that's what everybody thinks. But the autopsy reveals that the 82-year-old was murdered. It appears to be a murder without motive, as the grumpy old man lived a very secluded life and barely had any contact with other people. This is the ultimate horror scenario for early-retired Theo Kettling, who resides on the same floor as the victim and is the embodiment of despondency and trepidation. Is it possible that this was the work of some crazy serial killer, who plans on killing all the residents in the building?

Theo Kettling doesn't want to be the next victim and so he sets out to search for the killer. In doing so he has the active support of Lieselotte Larisch, a feisty retired school rector. At first, the rather bizarre detective duo that couldn't be more different if they tried attracts attention with their aimlessness and simple-mindedness while being worlds away from solving the case. But giving up is not an option for Lieselotte Larisch. Finally, a random discovery during a Sunday stroll leads them into the right direction: the key to solving the murder is hidden in an unsolved missing-person case that happened over half a century ago.

Michael Wagner, born in 1968, graduated in production engineering and is a trained journalist. Today he works as a public relations expert for a big industrial corporation and lives in the vicinity of Marburg. Funny, quirky, wacky. A road trip with undreamed-of obstacles

Björn Berenz's new novel is the perfect entertainment for readers with a warped sense of humor.

Is it possible for someone to be so desperately in love that they think a deceased loved one has returned in the form of an animal? When Simon, a bank officer, visits the Cologne zoo one day and meets a hippopotamus named Daisy, he is suddenly utterly convinced that the soul of his beloved wife, Sandra, who departed far too soon, has reincarnated in the animal. Simon is not a nutcase but a man who reasons analytically and actually knows better. Yet the evidence - as outlined in the Buddhist brochure he turns to for advice - is overwhelming.

Just about as overwhelming as the death sentence the zoo director has pronounced for the adipose, impotent, and slightly aggressive hippo, and would like to see as the main attraction of the animal's next public feeding. But not with Simon around. He aims to accomplish what he was prevented from doing once before: this time he will save his wife's soul from death by liberating Daisy from the zoo. But where do you go with a three-ton hippo? Sandra's greatest wish was to see Katavi National Park in Tanzania once in her life. And if it didn't work out in her first lifetime, then it will in her second. And so Simon and Daisy set off on a journey together.

This is the beginning of a quirky road trip across Europe, where the obstacles to be overcome include, among others, the police, the mafia, and a violent group of thieves. On the journey to Africa (which they never reach) Simon, with his tons of emotional baggage, finds his way back to life—and a woman finds a direct route to his heart.



Georg Weber, barely older than she is, deserted his unit during a bombing raid. Elli hides him and from now on, Georg lives and works on the farm in the constant fear of being discovered. The only thing that makes the withdrawn young man come out of his shell is music and so he breathes new life into the old piano of the Bruns family. Elli is always by his side and gradually a tender romantic relationship is developing between them. Martin, a farm hand who used to work as a musician before the war, recognizes Georg's potential and starts giving him singing lessons. Only a short time later, Georg receives a letter from his mother and decides to travel with Martin to Cologne to be with her.

Elli is very disappointed. Instead of announcing her engagement to Georg at the wedding reception of her best friend, she is forced to dance with her former classmate, Richard, and eventually, they find themselves making love in the hay. Elli is being haunted by terrible guilt and so is Georg, who, in his next letter, apologizes to her for his sudden and hasty departure. Elli is hoping in vain for more letters from Cologne. But then she receives an envelope from Georg's mother - with a card announcing his death.

Elli falls into a deep hole of depression. The reason is not only her grief for Georg but also the realization that she is pregnant, probably from Richard. She hides her pregnancy and in January of 1949, she secretly gives birth to a son. Her intention is to kill the newborn but then she sees his face. The little boy is clearly Georg's child.

Marlies Folkens was born in 1961 in Stollhamm-Ahndeich, a small village on the North Sea coast. She is the youngest of four children and grew up on a farm. After graduating from high school, she moved to Oldenburg to study history and political science. She still lives and works there.

But Dominique gives him the cold shoulder and rebuffs him. She does not care for the chivalrous behavior of noblemen. 

Clarissa is fascinated. After all, she has been trained from childhood and knows the challenges of the art of swordsmanship. The competing fencing guilds of St. Marx and the brotherhood of the Federfechter are enemies, resulting in constant duels.

On their return to Rostock, Clarissa and her father are attacked. When she regains consciousness, she learns that her father is dead. When she herself is suspected of murdering him, she disguises herself as a man and together with Leander, a young robber, sets out in search of the true killers.

Returning home, she finds a letter among her father's belongings. It reveals a conspiracy that could throw the entire empire into chaos. Catholics and Protestants are fighting for supremacy, militant Spaniards are forcing their way into the realm from the Netherlands, and another war against the Turks threatens to break out. Now, Clarissa learns from the letter that the Emperor is to be assassinated - by a fencer, of all people. Could her father have lost his life because he knew who the assassin would be?

Clarissa travels to Prague and takes a job under a false name as a lady-in-waiting. She and Leander work at rounding up the hostile fencing brotherhoods; only if they unite will they be able to prevent the carnage. And, indeed, they succeed in protecting the Emperor. In Prague Clarissa crosses paths with her uncle Carl who was believed to be dead. In the end, he informs her that her father isn't dead after all but has been thrown into prison.

Water, waves, and lots of wind: Welcome to the element of Freya Hoffmeister. For many years, the competitive canoeist has been one of the most successful extreme athletes in the world. After winning numerous sea kayaking competitions, she tackled a project in 2011 that no one had ever managed to accomplish: the circumnavigation of South America in a kayak. The trip took her four years - a journey that she describes in this book: gripping adventures, breathtaking observations of nature, and bizarre encounters with animals, but also life-and-death struggles with the merciless elements.

She started the 15,000-mile circumnavigation of South America in Buenos Aires on August 30, 2011. Other challenges that threatened the success of the entire project included exhausting climatic conditions, pathogens and parasites, mud flats, as well as a mangrove coastline with little infrastructure, continuous headwind, and dangerously high surge. In her autobiographical account of the trip, Freya Hoffmeister tells the story of this accomplishment of a lifetime, which is a unique example of courage and strengths.

Freya Hoffmeister, born in 1964 in Heikendorf, Schleswig-Holstein, completed an education for the higher levels of civil service before going into business for herself at the age of 22 by opening an ice cream parlor in Husum. The former contestant of the Miss Germany pageant expanded the shop into a chain of seven ice cream cafes and one salad bistro; in 2012, she ran two ice cream cafes as well as a huge Christmas store. Two managers and approximately 40 employees take care of the business operations.

For many years, Freya Hoffmeister competed as an artistic gymnast, as a bodybuilder, and as a skydiver. She completed over 1.500 jumps, 500 of them tandem jumps with a passenger parachutist. 

In 2015, Uwe Hauck was suffering from severe depression and committed himself to a psychiatric hospital. While many people still consider depression a taboo subject they don't like to bring up, Hauck dealt openly with it by tweeting with the hashtag #fromtheloonybin about his everyday life in the hospital. His tweets are a mixture of the observations he made on the psychiatric ward and thoughts about his illness.

"Actually most of the patients in the loony bin are normal people, who can no longer cope with the craziness of the outside world." This is the realization that Uwe Hauck tweeted on the third day of his stay in the mental hospital, in the beginning of this year. At first, he refused to believe that he was suffering from depression, like so many people do. After all, he has a wife who he loves and three children he adores. But a simple performance appraisal interview resulted in him swallowing pills and slashing his wrists. They found him in time and he was committed to a hospital.

Uwe Hauck decided to deal openly with his illness and help put an end to the stigmatization of mental diseases. With his book, he wants to inform about the taboo issue of depression, help alleviate the fear of people who are affected by it, and provide a look at what people can expect from a stay in a psychiatric hospital. Openly and with brutal honesty, he allows his readers to participate in his therapy. He manages to describe other patients in an entertaining, yet affectionate manner and is generous in sharing his humorous views of therapeutic approaches like painting, basket-weaving, and expressive dance.

With his book, the author manages to raise other people's awareness for the issue and to take away the fear of mental institutions because, ultimately, a psychiatric hospital is nothing but a hospital for broken souls.

Uwe Hauck works as a software developer for an IT service provider. He has a blog called "Living the Future" and he published two books about the future of our society. Uwe Hauck is the father of three children and owns a house in Swabia where he lives with his family. Besides his work as an author and as a blogger, he loves to ride his bicycle and is active in his support to increase people's understanding of mental illnesses, particularly depression.

A childhood marked by coldness

Amelie Sander is four-and-a-half years old when her ordeal begins: After her mother's suicide, she moves in with her father and his new wife. Lurking behind her stepmother's friendly façade is inconceivable sadism towards the other woman's child, which is perfectly hidden from the outside world.

As Amelie's stepmother systematically isolates the child from the outside world while terrorizing her with physical and psychological violence, the girl lives a completely dependent existence in a constant fear for her life and withers away. Right in the middle of an upper-middle-class neighborhood, Amelie is held captive in her parents' home for years, has to endure humiliation, is forced to neglect herself, and has to work like a slave cleaning. She is not allowed to brush her teeth and she is only allowed to wash herself when it is absolutely necessary. One glass of water a day has to suffice and the food that Amelie is given, is just enough for her not to starve.

She is 21 years old when she finally manages to escape from her tormentors' home with the help of a social worker. She is taken to a convent where she has to learn from scratch with the help of her mentor, a nun by the name of Sister Irmhild, how to live life in the "real" world. And a miracle happens: Within just a few months, the frightened ugly duckling turns into a swan – the real Amelie – a young woman bursting with curiosity and a zest for life who learns with eagerness and incredible courage to take her life into her own hands – and who, in the end, finds the love of her life. Today, Amelie Sander wants to tell her story.

Amelie Sander was born in a medium-sized town in Germany at the end of the 1960s. After her escape from her parents' home she had to learn from zero to hero how to deal with everyday life and stand on her own two feet. When she met her husband, her biggest wish came true: to find someone to love and trust wholeheartedly.

The fine line between a caring government and an intrusion of privacy

TORN APART is a thrilling personal-experience book with stories from the professional life of family lawyer Doris Schröder. In her book, the attorney offers an exclusive look into the courtroom and describes how court rulings decide over the personal lives of people. By ruling, for instance, who is given custody of the beloved child after a divorce. Or who is in charge of deciding the fate of the brain-dead father who is in a persistent vegetative state. And time and again: When is the government allowed to and when is it imperative for the government to step in and enforce decisions even against the will of the people affected by these rulings?

In her work with her clients, Doris Schröder has experienced many a time that people are pushed over the edge when they try everything in their power to hold their lives together. She tells the story of a father who kidnaps his child and takes him abroad for a life-saving surgery. Another story is about a disabled young man who wants to rid himself of the overbearing care of his parents – a decision with tragic consequences – and yet another one is about a young woman who wants a divorce from her violent husband despite the pressure from her family to stay married. At the core of these cases are broken trust, hurt feelings, and torn-apart family ties. Often, the government can help to alleviate injustice and restore order. Sometimes, however, the government can make things even worse by misjudging situations leaving people feeling horribly powerless.

Doris Schröder is very close to her stories, as she is a confidante for her clients and often the first person they open up to. She leads the reader into the abysses of human interaction and back by using clear words to analyze the legal aspect of the individual cases.

Doris Schröder has been working for many years as a family lawyer in Monheim und Dusseldorf. Over time, she learned to distance herself from her work, which is very important in her field, as her clients do not only seek her legal advice but also personal and psychological support. However, a family lawyer is not a family therapist. She has never been properly trained to solve problems within a family, so the focus is always on the legal aspect of the conflict. But is it always possible to distance yourself from your work?





Sonja Vukovic: OVER AND DONE Beauty knows no pain, says the pain

Worldwide, girls and boys start developing eating disorders at a younger age. One of them was Sonja Vukovic, who had been suffering from anorexia and bulimia for thirteen years. Always on the edge between frenzy and illness, Vukovic leads us deep into a misery each and every one of us could fall into – and shows us how she found her way into a healthy and happy life.

At first, the renowned addiction expert Sonja Vukovic helped her patient, Christiane F., (We Children from Bahnhof Zoo) with her look at her second life – then she had to admit to herself how sick she was. A gripping and dramatic story about abuse and eating disorders.

The little girl's years-long ordeal begins, when Nina's mother marries a new husband. Her stepfather humiliates her emotionally and physically. When he orders her to go looking for something and she cannot find it right away, he starts beating her with his hand, with a wooden spoon, with a belt – always on her bare skin. Sometimes she is not allowed to eat or drink for hours and has to wait in her bed until he comes to beat her up. Eventually, he begins to abuse her sexually. But Nina doesn't dare to talk about it to other people. Because – and this is the inconceivable part – all these humiliations take place under the eyes of her own mother.

She is already nine years old and visiting her biological father for the weekend, when he notices the black and blue welts on his daughter's body. He gets child protective services involved and one year later, Nina is finally allowed to live with him. But this is not the end of her suffering. The terrible experiences of her childhood keep haunting her. She cannot sleep, develops an eating disorder, and displays aggressive behavior. At school, she is labeled as rebellious and disobedient, and she cannot hold a job. She rushes into a marriage – with a man who beats her, too.

Finally, in 2010, she manages to put it all behind her. The crimes of her mother and her stepfather are past the statutes of limitations but she presses charges against her husband who is convicted of sexual assault. Furthermore, she starts a long-term therapy and is allowed to have a PTSD service dog. With her Labrador, Bullet, she is finally able to live a halfway normal life. The animal keeps strangers at bay, calms her down when she suffers a panic attack, and gives her the safety and security that had been missing in her life for so many years. Now she wants to catch up on her education – and she says, "Never again will I allow a man to beat me!"

C'MON MOM, CHILL is a book for all parents who haven't lost their sense of humor – just yet – over the task of raising children and prefer to laugh than to tear their hair out. Written in short episodes, it describes with tons of humor the adventures of a totally normal family while providing at the same time some sound advice about how to avoid mistakes and how to elegantly sail around menacing shoals. The superb dialogues with the children make this book a particularly enjoyable read.

The protagonists of this book are, on the one hand, the mother, who acts as a first-person narrator, and on the other hand, the two children: Puberticle, in short Pubi, is a vivacious middle school student and then there is his little sister, whose fluttery behavior is often reminiscent of a headless chicken so that she answers to the name of "Poultry". Also involved in some of the stories: the extremely busy father.

The 52 loosely interconnected stories that have the weekly rhythm of an early-evening television series, deal with the tasks of everyday life: Pubi dares the common cold virus ("You want to go swimming outside? It's only 10 degrees." Who cares, the sun is shining.") or uses the microwave to heat up his Spaghetti Bolognese ("There's been a little mishap.") Poultry, too, is fluent in speaking bluntly, for instance at the lunch table ("What little animals are in meat?") Together they are absolutely unbeatable ("Mom, do you actually like gray hair or why do you have so much of it?")

How Anke Müller manages to keep her cool in light of the daily drama in her family and why little monsters are best tamed with humor, that's what she tells you in this book.


