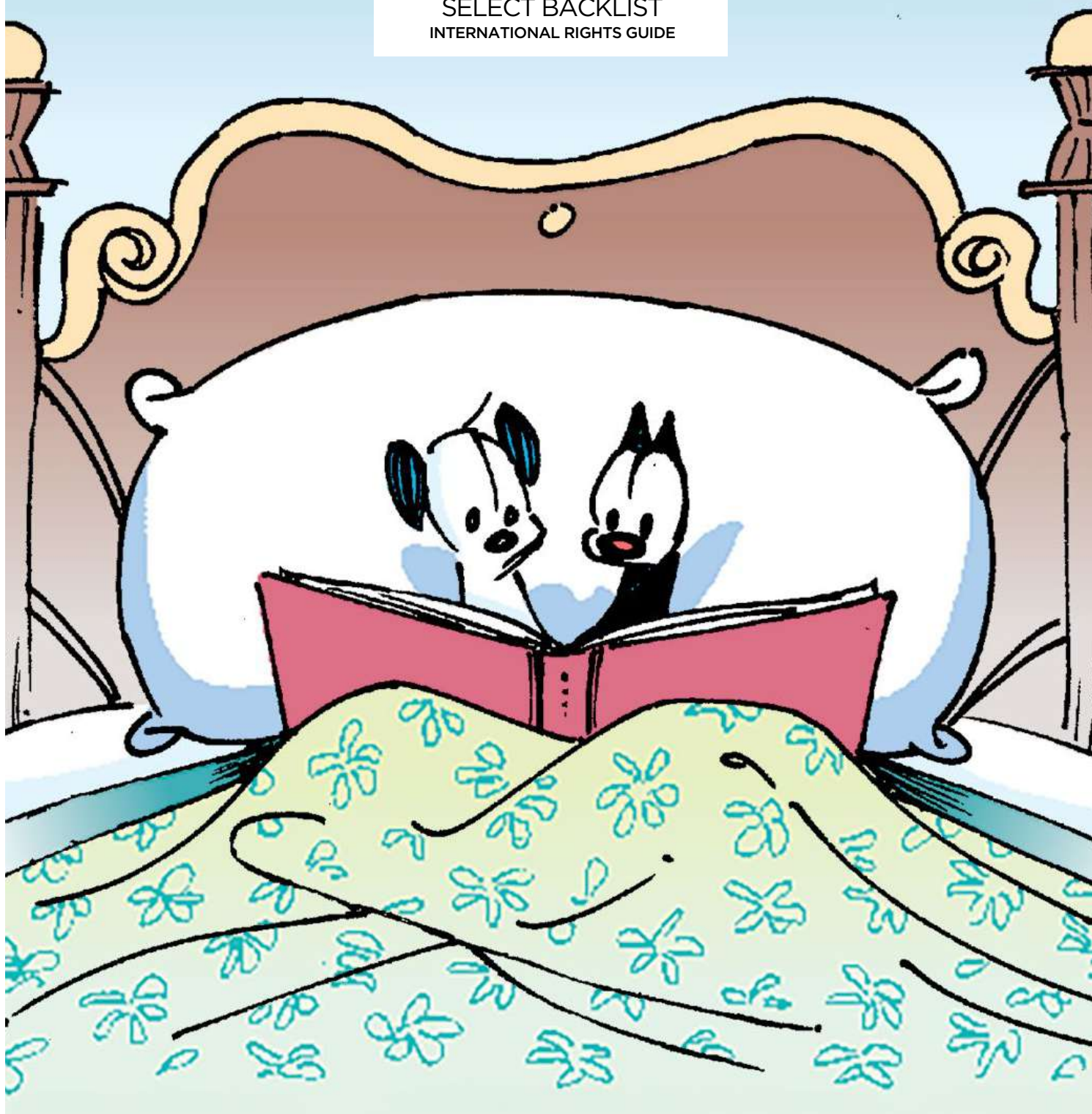

Long dismissed by Beatles fans as a “dragon lady” or “the woman who broke up the Beatles,” Yoko Ono’s work and legacy has often been viewed as parallel, if not separate to John Lennon’s.

Double Fantasy challenges that perception, chronicling the complicated, fascinating, and dramatic period between 1968 and 1980 when John Lennon left the Beatles, redefined himself, disappeared from the public to raise his son Sean with Yoko Ono—by telling their story from both Yoko and John’s perspective. In this incredible journey through the personal and creative lives of two of the most influential artists of all time, *Double Fantasy* argues—at times in John’s own words—that Yoko was not tangential to the process of making “John Lennon’s last album,” but rather his creative equal, constantly challenging him to make better, more personal work.

Viscerally presented in the graphic novel format, author Geoff Edgers and artist Molly Murakami take readers behind the scenes of one of the most complicated, fruitful, and misunderstood musical partnerships in history, drawing from unparalleled access and new reporting to bring this story to life.

Geoff Edgers is the national arts reporter at *The Washington Post*, where he’s profiled everyone from Eddie Murphy and Chevy Chase to Sinead O’Connor and Ava DuVernay, and has written children’s books on the Beatles, Stan Lee, and Julia Child. He lives in Massachusetts with his wife, Carlene, and children Lila and Calvin. **Molly Murakami** is a cartoonist, illustrator, and writer from Minneapolis, Minnesota. She has worked with Bleacher Report, Candlewick Press, First Second, IDW, and others. In 2020, she was the recipient of a MICE mini-grant for *In Your Path*, an autobiography about her family’s history with the Japanese–American internment camps during the second World War. In 2021, she was named one of two artists in residence at Densho. **Kendall Goode** is a comic artist and illustrator from Richmond, Virginia. He has worked as a main artist on titles such as *The Books of Clash* (First Second), *Dirtbag Rapture* (Oni Press), and has colorist credits on *Wonder Woman: The Adventures of Young Diana* (DC Comics), *Young Alfred: Pain In The Butler* (DC Comics), and *Harley Quinn’s Bud and Lou: Trouble Times Two* (DC Comics). **K Czap** is an award-nominated cartoonist who has worked with publishers such as Scholastic, First Second, and Little, Brown and Company. Czap received the CXC Emerging Talent Award in 2016 for their work and involvement in the comics community and in 2022, was nominated for the “Outstanding Artist” and “Outstanding Comic” Ignatz Awards for *Four Years*. They live in Rhode Island with their partner, Cathy G. Johnson.

POPULAR SUBJECT: The Beatles and Yoko Ono are an effervescent point of interest in pop culture, as powerful in 2026 as they were in 1966. Each a legendary musician and artist in their own right, their stories have been told so many times across so many formats, including graphic novels like *Baby’s in Black* and *The Fifth Beatle*, but this is the first with a specific focus.

NEW PERSPECTIVE: Yoko’s story is long overdue for re-examination, as not only a rare voice in rock-and-roll history, but an innovative performance artist whose work John Lennon himself cites as having directly inspired hit songs such as *Imagine*.

Finding Paradise Island

MY LIFE IN SAN FRANCISCO AND HOW IT BECAME THE QUEEREST CITY IN THE WORLD

From Lambda Award–winning, Eisner–nominated comics scholar, curator, and author Justin Hall comes a graphic novel that is equal parts an unapologetically gay memoir and a love letter to the queer history of San Francisco



“United we stand. Divided they catch us one by one.” —José Sarria, 1961

San Francisco is home to one of the largest LGBTQIA+ communities in the world—a hotbed of queer culture over a century in the making, and the poster city for the fight for gay rights in America. But how do you build a queer city? This Justin Hall project illustrates six events in San Francisco’s history beginning in 1955, including the founding of the Daughters of Bilitis, José Sarria’s groundbreaking political campaign, the opening of the Tool Box Bar, the 1965 raid of the New Year party of the Council on Religion and the Homosexual, the Compton Cafeteria Riots, all leading up to the city’s first Pride march in 1970. Each historical chapter is illustrated by a different cartoonist, including Dave Davenport, Allegra Figeroid, Diego Gómez, John Macy, and Bishakh Som.

Along the way, Justin Hall weaves in memoir chapters about his experience with San Francisco—the good, the bad, and how moving to the city from the East Coast let him explore his identity as a gay man and find community in the city’s leather scene.

Justin Hall is the co–creator of *True Travel Tales*, *Hard to Swallow*, and *Theater of Terror: Revenge of the Queers*. He has work in *The Best American Comics*, *The Best Erotic Comics*, and the *San Francisco Weekly*, among other publications. Hall created the Lambda Award–winning and Eisner–nominated *No Straight Lines: Four Decades of Queer Comics* and produced a documentary based on that book which debuted at the Tribeca Film Festival in 2021 and won an L.A. Outfest Grand Jury Award for best documentary. He has curated international museum shows of LGBTQ+ comics art and is the first Fulbright Scholar of Comics. Hall is an Associate Professor of Comics at California College of the Arts, and the co–organizer of the *Queers & Comics Conference*.

LGBTQIA+ HISTORY: This in–depth look at San Francisco’s LGBTQIA+ history explores how a queer community—arguably *the* most famous queer community in America—was built, from José Sarria, the Colombian American drag queen whose 1961 political campaign paved the way for the election of Harvey Milk, to the Daughters of Bilitis, as told by one cartoonist’s experience of that community in the modern day.

ACCESSIBLE FORMAT: Graphic novel nonfiction is an accessible and approachable way to bring history to life and is a staple of LGBTQIA+ memoir from *Gender Queer* to *Fun Home*.

TIMELY SUBJECT MATTER: With LGBTQIA+ rights under attack across the country, this book asks how the communities that we take for granted today were built, how the people who made them fought for equality, and what parts of the fight remain while celebrating what we’ve won in the present.

The Best We Can Do was an American Book Award winner and is an intimate and moving graphic novel memoir of one family's journey from their war–torn home in Vietnam to their new lives in America. This beautifully illustrated and emotional story explores the anguish of immigration and the lasting effects that displacement has on a child and her family.

At the heart of Bui's story is a universal struggle: While adjusting to life as a first–time mother, she ultimately discovers what it means to be a parent—the sacrifices, the unnoticed gestures, and the depths of unspoken love. Despite how impossible it seems to take on the simultaneous roles of both parent and child, Bui pushes through. With haunting, poetic writing and breathtaking art, she examines the strength of family, the importance of identity, and the meaning of home.

This timely and urgent anniversary edition of *The Best We Could Do* includes additional pages of new material, including a teacher's guide, never–before–seen process materials, a Q&A, and illustrated testimonials about the importance of *The Best We Could Do* from Viet Thanh Nguyen, Bao Phi, Ali Wong, and select readers.

Thi Bui was born in Vietnam three months before the end of the American War and came to the United States in 1978 as part of the “boat people” wave of refugees from Southeast Asia. Her debut graphic memoir, *The Best We Could Do* (Abrams ComicArts, 2017), was the winner of the American Book Award and has been selected as UCLA's Common Book for 2017, a National Book Critics Circle finalist in autobiography, an Eisner Award finalist in Reality–Based Work, and made several “Best of 2017” book lists, including Bill Gates's top five picks. Bui is also the Caldecott Honor–winning illustrator of *A Different Pond*, a picture book by the poet Bao Phi (2017), *Finding Papa*, a picture book by Angela Pham Kranz (2023), and *Ride / Dap Xe* another picture book by Bao Phi (2026). With her son, Hien, she co–illustrated the children's book, *Chicken of the Sea* (2019), written by Pulitzer Prize winner Viet Thanh Nguyen and his son, Ellison. Her short comics can be found online at *The Nib*, *Reveal News*, PEN America, and BOOM California. Bui taught high school in New York City and was a founding teacher of Oakland International High School, the first public high school in California for recent immigrants and English learners. Since 2015, she has been a faculty member of the MFA in Comics program at the California College of the Arts. Bui lives in New Orleans.

In *The Heavy*, author and illustrator Shawn Martinbrough tells the hard-hitting story of Charles "Dukes" Duchamp, a New York based debt collector with a love for jazz and a loss that has haunted him for years. Each week, Dukes makes his rounds collecting money for Basil—Leon Panassie, an eccentric club owner with criminal ties in New York and abroad.

When Basil announces a change in business and a night's worth of collections goes missing, Dukes pursues a vicious, former colleague who escapes to Paris. Although the City of Light holds dark memories for him, Dukes has never let a debt go uncollected, and in order to set things right, he must face his fears and retrieve what has been taken.

The Heavy is an original, contemporary noir themed graphic novel about rivals, revenge, and redemption.

Shawn Martinbrough is an Eisner Award nominated artist whose comic book projects include ; *Batman: Detective Comics*, *Luke Cage Noir*, *The Black Panther*, *Hellboy*, *Promethee 13:13*, *Anansi Boys* and the NAACP Image Award nominated, bestselling kid's book, *Like Lava in My Veins* published by Nancy Paulsen Books/ Penguin Kids. He is the writer of *Red Hood: The Hill* for DC Comics, co-author of *Judge Kim and the Kids' Court* for Simon & Schuster and is currently writing and illustrating original graphic novels for Ignition Press, Image Comics and First Second/ 23rd Street Books. He is also a Vanity Fair contributor, an art curator and currently draws / writes in Washington, D.C.

In this graphic novel adaptation of the #1 *New York Times* bestselling author N. K. Jemisin’s short story “Red Dirt Witch”—which was featured in the 2018 short story collection *How Long ’Til Black Future Month?*—we are introduced to Emma, a single Black mother of three in a backwater Alabama town in segregated 1940s America. In this alternative universe, magic and faeries exist, and Emma must use her Afrocentric cultural “magicks” against a supernatural force that wants to enslave her daughter, Pauline. Jemisin infuses this world with the magic, complexity, and power of oral Black folklore that have become trademarks of her work in trilogies like *The Broken Earth* and *Inheritance*.

Red Dirt Witch has been expertly adapted into the graphic novel format by writer Kinitra Brooks and illustrators Shomari Harrington and Ashley A. Woods. They have translated Jemisin’s powerful prose into a stunning visual story of family and sacrifice. A heartbreaking reminder of the many injustices that Black mothers still have to endure in our country to ensure a better future for their children, this story will resonate with readers everywhere.

N. K. Jemisin is a science-fiction and fantasy writer and a psychologist based in New York. Her fiction explores a wide variety of themes, including cultural conflict and oppression. She has won several awards for her work, including the Locus Award and four Hugo Awards, three of which were for each of the books in her *Broken Earth* series—making her the only author to have won the Hugo Award for Best Novel in three consecutive years and the first author to have won for all three books in a trilogy. In 2020, Jemisin was the recipient of a MacArthur Genius Grant, and in 2021, she was named one of *TIME* magazine’s “100 most influential people.” **Kinitra D. Brooks** is the Audrey and John Leslie Endowed Chair in Literary Studies in the department of English at Michigan State. She specializes in the study of Black women, genre fiction, and popular culture. She currently has three books in print: *Searching for Sycorax: Black Women’s Hauntings of Contemporary Horror*, *Sycorax’s Daughters*, and *The Lemonade Reader*. She is also the co-editor of the *New Suns* book series. She lives in East Lansing, Michigan. **Shomari Harrington** graduated with a bachelor’s degree in film majoring in animation from Columbia College Chicago. His artwork has also appeared at the exhibition *Milestones: African Americans in Comics, Pop Culture and Beyond*, hosted at the Geppi Museum of Entertainment in Baltimore, Maryland. **Ashley A. Woods** is an artist from Chicago. She got her start through self-publishing her action-fantasy comic series *Millennia War*, which led her to a career in comics and TV, including *Niobe*, *Tomb Raider*, and *Wonder Woman*, HBO’s *Lovecraft Country*, and *Jupiter Invincible* with Pulitzer Prize-winning author Yusef Komunyakaa, which premiered at the Tribeca Film Festival in June 2021. Her work has received international recognition, including in Kyoto, Japan, where she presented in a gallery showcase titled *Out of Sequence*.

Framing Emmett Till

EXPOSING DARK FEAR

● BY CHRISTOPHER BENSON; ILLUSTRATED BY ERIC BATTLE

A graphic novel biography about one of America’s most heinous race crimes, *Framing Emmett Till: Exposing Dark Fear* follows an anonymous Black writer as he investigates Emmett’s murder, confronting not only the unresolved truths of the past, but the ways Black pain is consumed, reshaped, and monetized in the present.



On August 28, in the the summer of 1955 in Mississippi, fourteen-year-old Emmett Till was abducted, lynched, and his body then thrown into the Tallahatchie River by two white men. A white woman named Carol Bryant had accused young Emmett of making advances on her. Bryant’s husband and his half-brother then hunted down, tortured, and murdered Emmett. Three days later, his mutilated body was pulled from the river.

In Emmett’s home city of Chicago, his mother, Mamie Till–Mobley, insisted on an open casket funeral. Tens of thousands of people attended the ceremony, including the media, and the grotesque images of Emmett’s body were printed in *Jet* magazine and quickly spread throughout the nation, serving as a catalyst for the civil rights movement.

Drawing from acclaimed journalist Christopher Benson’s firsthand experience collaborating with Mamie Till–Mobley on his first book, *Framing Emmett Till: Exposing Dark Fear* reexamines history. This graphic novel follows an anonymous Black writer pulled into the seductive, exploitative machinery of Hollywood while interviewing Mamie and revisiting the case decades later. As he investigates Emmett’s murder, he confronts not only the unresolved truths of the past, but the ways Black pain is consumed, reshaped, and monetized in the present.

Christopher Benson is an Emmy Award–winning lawyer, journalist, and associate professor at Northwestern University’s Medill School of Journalism. He co-authored, with the late Mamie Till–Mobley (Emmett Till’s mother), of *Death of Innocence: The Story of the Hate Crime That Changed America*, which was nominated for a Pulitzer Prize and which won a Robert F. Kennedy Book Award for Special Recognition and the BlackBoard Nonfiction Book of the Year. Formerly the Washington editor of *Ebony*, Benson has contributed to *Chicago* magazine, the *Chicago Tribune*, the *Chicago Sun–Times*, and *The New York Times*. **Eric Battle** is an illustrator, curator, and art director whose career has covered the spectrum of comic books and graphic novels, children’s books, fashion, and advertising. He is most recognized for his dynamic and compelling visuals, and has illustrated the stories of many popular icons, from Spider–Man and the X–Men to Batman and Godzilla. His collaborators include bestselling novelist L.A. Banks (on her *Vampire Huntress Legends* novel series), World Fantasy Award–winning author Nnedi Okorafor, AMC’s *Walking Dead* producer Gale Anne Hurd, and *Game of Thrones* author George R. R. Martin. In October 2023, Eric was recruited by the US Mint’s Artistic Infusion Program (AIP) to add his dynamic design and visual sensibilities to upcoming coin and medal designs.

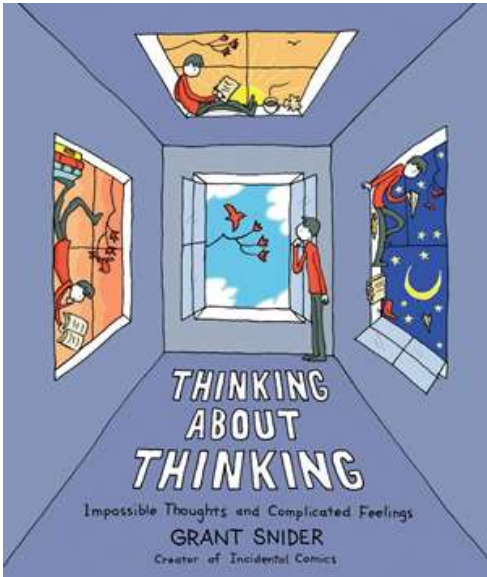

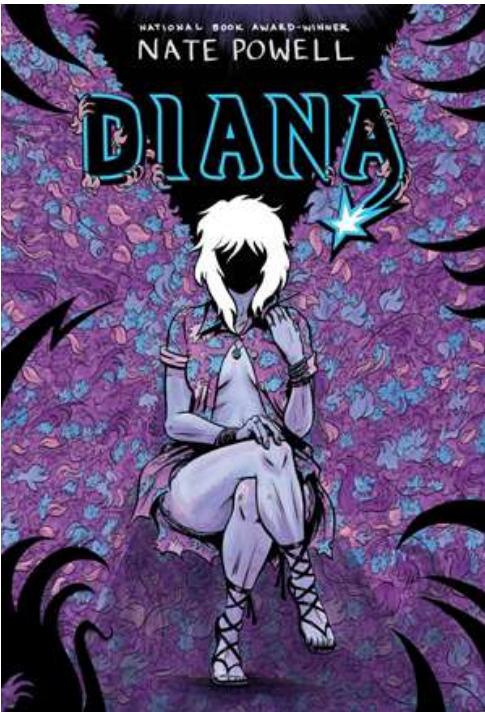
