THE TABLE IN THE CORNER

A multi-generational family drama with echoes of Maggie O'Farrell, Anne Enright, and Jonathan Coe, this powerful debut novel is a meditation on the destructive and redemptive power of love.

The searing heatwave of 1976 saw a summer of parched fields, swarming insects, and cracked roads, and the heat itself became another volatile character in the lives of millions. On the hottest day for centuries, Gillian Robinson bundles her three children out of the house for their regular Sunday lunch, leaving her husband Tony bleeding at the bottom of the stairs. What follows is a story of love and survival, where secrecy and sacrifice shape the lives of every member of this fractured family.

Moving between the blistering present of 1976, the tender courtship of Gillian and Tony in the late 1950s, and the aftershocks of that fateful day, the novel explores how violence, desire, and impulsive decisions reverberate through generations. It is also a story of Philip, the eldest son, who falls in love with Marco, the Italian restaurateur's son, and whose writing ultimately provides a way out, though not without its own painful reckonings. As Gillian grapples with guilt, Tony returns home fractured and unpredictable; neighbours pry, and secrets deepen.

Alison Barrow has worked in PR in UK publishing for over 30 years with some of the most successful writers published in the last three decades. Born and raised in Harrogate in Yorkshire, her roots continue to inspire her work and creativity every day. Yorkshire never leaves her side. An avid reader since she first collected six books every Saturday from the local library, Alison's reading tastes are wide. Even when dog walking, she has an audiobook with her. Alison began writing fiction quietly in the time she was away from her day job, on trains, in airports, in hotel rooms, on the commute, at home.
