As we enter these characters' lives, and lightly tread our way through their brains, their bedrooms, their backstories and beyond, we will see what it is they all hope for and hide - and learn just why The Maker has chosen to meet them.

THE CRIME WRITER

JILL DAWSON

At once a brilliant portrait of Patricia Highsmith in all her oddness and a pitch-perfect Highsmith-like tale of duplicity, obsession and murder.

In 1964, the eccentric American novelist Patricia Highsmith is hiding out in a cottage in Suffolk in order to concentrate on her writing. She has other motives too - a secret romance with a married woman based in London and her dislike of the fame and attention that has followed her since her first novel was made into a Hitchcock film and her fourth, The Talented Mr Ripley, was published to such acclaim.

Unfortunately it soon becomes clear that Pat is not alone: all her demons have come with her. Prowlers, sexual obsessives, frauds, imposters, suicides and murderers: the tropes of her fictions clamour for her attention, rudely intruding on her peaceful Suffolk retreat.

After the arrival of Ginny, an enigmatic young journalist who would like to interview her, events begin to turn catastrophically dark, ending in a fatal accident. Except, as always in Pat's troubled and eventful life, perhaps things are not as they seem....

Jill Dawson is the author of Trick of the Light, Magpie, Fred and Edie, which was shortlisted for the Whitbread Novel Award and the Orange Prize, Wild Boy, Watch Me Disappear, which was longlisted for the Orange Prize, The Great Lover, a Richard and Judy Summer Read in 2009, Lucky Bunny and The Tell-Tale Heart. In addition she has edited six anthologies of short stories and poetry.

Generation is a short novel that contains a huge amount, taking place over eighty years, three continents and three generations.

At its heart is Áine, a recently divorced woman in her thirties who wants some kind of escape from her life in Ireland: from her ex-husband and his pregnant girlfriend, her mundane job and unexciting love life. So she goes to stay for a few weeks on an organic farm near Chicago, with her six-year-old daughter Daisy. The trip doesn't turn out as she imagined it would, and that summer will have unforeseeable consequences for everyone involved.

Ambitious and gripping, *Generation* moves effortlessly from the smallest of details to the largest of canvases, as the repercussions of the decisions taken by parents play out in the lives of their children for years to come.

Paula McGrath has recently completed an MFA at University College, Dublin, and was shortlisted for the inaugural Maeve Binchy Travel Award (2014). *Generation* is her first novel.

ANDREY KURKOV

An allegorical epic of the Soviet soul set between the end of World War II and fall of Communism - By the bestselling author of Death and the Penguin

The Great Patriotic War is drawing to a close, but a darkness has fallen over Soviet Russia. And for a disparate, disconnected clutch of wanderers - many thousands of miles apart, linked only by a common goal - four parallel journeys are just beginning.

Born near Leningrad in 1961, Kurkov was a journalist, prison warder, cameraman and screenplay-writer before his novels took off. He received "hundreds of rejections" and was a pioneer of self-publishing, selling more than 75,000 copies of his books in a single year. His novel Death and the Penguin, his first in English translation, was an international bestseller, drawing acclaim from all quarters. He lives in Kiev with his English wife and their three children.

THE PARABLE BOOK

PER OLOV ENOUIST

The true story of a love affair between a fifteen-year old boy and a 51-year-old woman

Perola, who is not so distinguishable from Enquist himself, lived in Västerbotten in Sweden's far north Ellen a visitor from south of Stockholm rented a cottage there for a summer. He is 15. She is 51. The attraction is instant. Their ages palindromic. They lie down together on the knot-free pine floor.

For Perola, sexuality was "like opening the innermost door to another person". It freed him from his religious upbringing and allowed him to become the writer he became, a titan of Swedish letters.

This is the love story he never thought he would be able to write. And a distillation of the life and work of a great author, who owes it all to an encounter with an older woman on a knot-free pine floor.

Per Olov Enquist is one of Sweden's leading contemporary writers, both as a novelist and a playwright. He has twice won the August Prize for fiction.

CRY MOTHER SPAIN

LYDIE SALVAYRE

A powerful collage of love, faith and revolution during the Spanish Civil War from the current Prix Goncourt laureate.

Two intertwining voices recount the early days of the Spanish Civil War.

First: the novelist Georges Bernanos, devout right-wing Catholic. Initially sympathetic to the aims of Franco, Bernanos becomes horrified by the brutality of the fascist forces, and by the complicity of his church. He confronts his faith in a virulently anti-Franco pamphlet, prompting Franco to put a price on his head.

The second voice is that of Montse, who many years later, is telling her daughter about the horrors of her adolescence and the fervour with which revolution gripped rural Spain. Her story plays out through the bitter conflict between her brother Josep, anarchist, and her future husband Diego, an impassioned Stalinist. A war within a war between communists and anarchists, whilst around them the fascist forces continue their relentless ideological purge.

Drawing inspiration from her own mother's perilous life under Franco's reign of terror, and the real-life rightwing novelist George Bernanos' Damascene conversion, Salvayre deftly weaves together narratives, languages and perspectives to create a multi-faceted, original tapestry of the experience of love, faith and revolution.

Lydie Salvayre is a former psychiatrist, who grew up near Toulouse after her exiled republican parents fled Franco's regime. As a child she spoke Spanish, only learning French after starting school. She studied medicine and specialised as a psychiatrist in Marseille, before beginning to write at the end of the 70's, with her first works appearing in literary reviews in Aix-en-Provence and Marseille around the beginning of the 1980's. Her novel La Compagnie des spectres won the Prix Novembre in 1997 and was named Book of the Year by Lire. Pas Pleurer won the Prix Goncourt in 2014.

Does it matter if you can't remember? A novel about betrayal and consent, truth and denial, in the age of the smartphone

It's the beginning of the summer in a small town in Ireland. Emma O'Donovan is eighteen years old, beautiful, happy, confident.

One night, there's a party. Everyone is there. All eyes are on Emma.

The next morning, she wakes on the front porch of her house. She can't remember what happened, she doesn't know how she got there.

She doesn't know why she's in pain.
