Eugene Finkel was born in Ukraine and is an expert on Ukraine and political violence. He is associate professor of international affairs at the Johns Hopkins University, School of Advanced International Studies. He is a scholar of political violence, war and genocide, mostly in Eastern Europe and Israel/Palestine. He was the first Western expert to argue that Russian violence against civilians in Ukraine meets the definition of genocide.

The explicit goal of Russia's invasion is to dismantle the US-dominated post-Cold War global order and resurrect the Kremlin's control of Eurasia. It has killed tens of thousands, displaced millions, revived the threat of a nuclear war between Russia and the West and might unleash a global famine. The violence has and will continue to shape European and global politics for decades to come.

This book zooms in on the intersection of the most important geopolitical event in recent decades and the most odious type of violence. The book will demonstrate that Russian violence against Ukrainian civilians is not an unintended collateral damage of warfare but a deliberate, large scale campaign of mass murder.

Since the 19th century dominating Ukraine and denying Ukrainians independent identity has been the cornerstone of Russia/Soviet policy. Finkel presents this history of genocidal violence, how it unfolded and was experienced by its victims. This violence is a direct continuation of the Kremlin's playbook of dealing with domestic and foreign opposition.

But witchcraft and attitudes towards it and its practitioners has changed according to place and time and the interests and politics of the day. This book will use thirteen significant trials to explore the history of witchcraft and witch hunts. As well as investigating some of the most famous trials from the Middle Ages to the 18th century, such as Salem, it will take us in new and surprising directions. It will show us how witchcraft was decriminalised in the 18th century, only to be reimagined by the 1780s Romantic radicals. We will learn how it evolved from being seen as a threat to Christianity to being seen as gendered persecution, and how trials against chieftains in Africa stoked anger against colonial rule.

Significantly, the book will tell the stories of the victims – those women whose stories have too often been overshadowed by those of the powerful men, such as King James VI and I and "Witchfinder General" Matthew Hopkins, who hounded them. While this will be a history of witchcraft, the subject cannot be consigned to the history books. Hundreds of people, mostly women, are tried and killed as witches every year in Africa. 'WITCH HUNT!' is as common in our language today as ever it was, and witches are still on trial across the world.

Dementia, heart failure and cancer are now the leading causes of death in industrialised nations, where life expectancy is mostly above 80. A century ago, life expectancy was about 50 and people died mainly from infectious diseases. In the Middle Ages, death was mostly caused by famine, plague, childbirth and war. In the Palaeolithic period, where our species spent 95% of its time, we frequently died from violence and accidents.

Causes of death have changed irrevocably across time. In the course of a few centuries we have gone from a world where disease or violence were likely to strike anyone at any age, and where famine could be just one bad harvest away, to one where excess food is more of a problem than a lack of it. Why is this? Why don't we die from plague, scurvy or smallpox any more? And why are heart attacks, Alzheimer's and cancer so prevalent today?

Most women aren't talking to each other about what they do and don't do with it, and no one is asking the questions we all have about how it might be affecting us. Pornhub claims at least a third of their current user base are women, and a study from the British Board of Film Classification found a difference of just 18% between the use of young boys and young girls. In a world where porn sites get more visitors each month than Netflix, Amazon, and Twitter combined, what we need is a 'me too' moment for porn.

Combining popular culture, research and thinking from the past thirty years, with real-life accounts taken from one hundred women aged from 18–70, *Women on Porn* answers the call for an accessible, informed, evidence- based exploration of what pornography means for women (and to us all). *Women on Porn* claims that we've been thinking about women and porn all wrong. Fiona celebrates the empowering nature of megalith hunting, a hobby that, in her opinion, offers a profound way of interacting with our collective past and individual fates. Most of all she makes the point that tramping through fields in search of standing stones is just a huge amount of fun.

Standing stones are enjoying widespread interest at the moment and Fiona positions this revival of megalith enthusiasm within the growth of movements such as Right to Roam, which promotes access to the countryside for all, and the work of artists such as Ben Edge, who sees visiting standing stones as a political act, enabling people of all backgrounds to find a common community in the precolonial deep past.
